We will address all competencies listed in the Code of Federal Regulations 29 CFR 1910.120(q)(6)(ii) for hospital employees trained to the First Responder Awareness and Operations Level designated to decontaminate victims. It will address the specific job functions and responsibilities of a decon team that will aid in creating a highly efficient decontamination process.
